

The Feast of Pentecost I

“Blessed – happy, fortunate (to be envied) – are the people who know the joyful sound (**who understand and appreciate the spiritual blessings symbolized by the Feasts**); they shall walk, O Lord, in the light and favor of Thy countenance” *Psalm 89:15 Amplified*

Consider *Deuteronomy 16:16*...

I

The Feast of Weeks is the second of the three great Jewish feasts.

The Feast of Weeks was celebrated at Jerusalem yearly.

The feast was celebrated the seventh week after the Passover. *Exodus 19:1–3*

The feast was in grateful recognition of the **completed harvest**.

The feast of weeks is also called Pentecost which means "the fiftieth day".

Consider *Leviticus 23:15–17*

II

Consider *Acts 1:3* and *Acts 2:1*

40 days post-resurrection ministry of Jesus
10 days tarrying of the disciples
50 days to Pentecost

III

The number 50 is used symbolically to represent liberty, **freedom** or **deliverance**.

This is seen in the fact the every 50th year ($7 \times 7 = 49 + 1 = 50$) Israel was called the year of Jubilee.

During the Jubilee **slaves** were set free, debts were cancelled, families were **reunited** and liberty was proclaimed **through** the land.

During this season expect to be set free and delivered.

IV

Israel consider Pentecost the day Moses received the Ten Commandments from God.

Consider *Jeremiah 31:31–34* and *Hebrews 8:8–13*

During this season God will write His laws in our minds and our hearts.

The Feast of the Lord is going on!
